## <u>Major Edwards Elementary School Report</u> September School Committee Meeting

The Major Edwards 2024-2025 school year is off to a very smooth start. We welcomed back students in first through fifth grade on Wednesday, 8/28. The first three days of school went seamlessly with the slight changes that we have made for this school year. We welcomed several new students and families to the district and it was great to see the students that have been coming to Major Edwards over the years helping the new students get acclimated with the school.

During the first week, we had our Kindergarten screening for our incoming kindergarten students and held both the preschool and Kindergarten open houses. This was a good way to ease the new students into the school as they transition into kindergarten and preschool. This allowed them to become familiar with the school, meet their teachers, see their classrooms, and enjoy a bus ride around West Boylston. Kindergarten and Preschool students had their first days last week on Wednesday, 9/4, and on Thursday, 9/5.

During the first few weeks of school, teachers and students reviewed the rules, expectations, and routines throughout the classrooms and the different areas of school such as the cafeteria, hallways, playground, and during the arrival and dismissal process. This time was spent reviewing and practicing procedures in order to establish a safe, positive environment for all students so that they are comfortable with their surroundings and ready to learn.

During our first two days of professional development at the beginning of the year, our teachers participated in a district wide training by The I Love U Guys Foundation that focused on the Standard Response Protocol and the Standard Reunification Method for responding in emergency situations. Special Education Teachers and support staff participated in a training led by Kristin Nasuti on the newly implemented IEP in MA and also reviewed important updates from the Special Education Department.

We had several new paraprofessionals join our school district this year and they all participated in a training led by Sherri Traina to review what the paraprofessional role entails and the specific responsibilities and expectations that are in place as they support students throughout the district. Lastly, Matt MacAvoy provided training for all staff regarding Special Education law and regulations, 504 Plan requirements, and an overview of the recent changes to Title IX and Civil Rights regulations.

# Middle/High School Report September 2024 School Committee Meeting

Our opening of the 2024-2025 school year has been excellent. Mrs. Smith and I are pleased with the new staff that we have hired for the middle/high school. Now in our second year of the new high school schedule, we continue to see the positive impact on student motivation, academic achievement, and on the overall tone of the building. Once again our senior class did a great job of welcoming all students and staff on opening day. School pictures and assemblies went very smoothly as we set expectations for a productive, cooperative, and respectful school culture. We are truly excited for this school year to be the best ever.

Highlights of our class meetings with students and staff included: Setting the tone and strong leadership from grade 12. We warmly welcomed our freshman class in their first year of high school. We spoke to grade 8 about being leaders in their final year of middle school as we plan for a class trip to Washington DC. We greeted our new grade 6 students as they started middle

school and welcomed back our 7th grade students who are now middle school veterans. ## <u>Superintendent's Report</u> September 2024 School Committee Meeting

### **School Crisis Training**

On August 26, 2024 the District welcomed the return The I Love U Guys Foundation for a presentation for all staff. While the Foundation did provide an overview of various crisis response scenarios in January 2024, less than half of the staff were in attendance, as special education teachers were involved in another training session and the date was not contractual work day for paraprofessionals. The Foundations core training was once again focused upon a Standard Response Protocol, Standard Reunification Method. Crisis responses that were addressed included hold, secure, lockdown, evacuate and shelter. Once again, Stacy Avila was the Instructional Coordinator for the presentation. Stacy was a law enforcement officer and hostage negotiator in Colorado for over twenty years before joining "I Love U Guys" seven years ago. She has presented in several Massachusetts communities, most recently a two day training session with the administration of Worcester public schools.

The District will be meeting with representatives from the West Boylston Police and Fire Departments on September 12, 2024 to continue crisis planning strategies and drills. Chief Minnach, Sgt. Petit, and Chief Sadowski will be participating in the session. A meeting of the school safety committee will be scheduled for later in September.

#### **Special Education Training**

Matthew MacAvoy, ESQ (Nutall, MacAvoy, & Joyce) provided training for all staff on August 27, 2024. Attorney MacAvoy's presentation focused upon Special Education law and regulations, 504 Plan requirements, and an overview of the recent changes to Title IX/ Civil Rights regulations.

## **Transportation Report**

Four hundred eighty nine students have been issued bus passes for the 2024-2025 school year. The number of riders from Major Edwards is 279, and the number of Middle/High School riders is 210 (Middle School riders 122 and High School riders 88).

Collected transportation fees as of September 1, 2024 total \$34,600, a \$2,200 increase from September 2023. The total cost of the regular transportation program for 2023-2024 is \$364,000, a decrease of \$9,000.

Oscar Esposito – Physical Education Teacher – Major Edwards Elementary School


